

## CHAPTER 66.

### Streets and Sidewalks.<sup>1</sup>

§ 66.01. Removal of snow and ice from sidewalk.

§ 66.02. Dangerous materials.

#### **Sec. 66.01. Removal of snow and ice from sidewalk.**

It shall be the duty of the owner or occupant of property adjacent to any sidewalks within the city to remove snow and ice on such sidewalk within six hours after daylight and after snow has ceased to fall. In addition to the penalty for violation of this code, if the owner or occupant fails to remove such snow or ice and the cost of such removal shall be charged against the property and shall be collected in the same manner as taxes. (Code 1960, §§ 21-17, 21-19.)

#### **Sec. 66.02. Dangerous materials.**

It shall be unlawful for any person to place, throw upon, cause to be placed upon, discharged upon or permit to be placed upon or remain upon any street or sidewalk within the city any dirt, sand, clay, gravel, concrete or other similar foreign material deemed dangerous to vehicular and/or pedestrian traffic.

The penalty for violation of this section shall be regulated by the penalties prescribed by this code. (Ord. No. 32-76, § 2.)
